School sport received a major boost on 3 May 2014 when the president of France signed the historic Football in Schools agreement. In line with that breakthrough, the Union Nationale du Sport Scolaire (National Union of School Sport) remains committed to promoting football within all of France's sports associations.


The game of football already enjoys a presence in half of France's schools, with 4,500 sports associations playing it at secondary-school level, 140,000 youngsters involved in futsal and 105,000 taking part in football. As a result, it is comfortably one of the five most popular disciplines practised in schools, from among the 82 sports documented by the UNSS.

The sport is also becoming more popular with girls, who now make up 13% of the total number of players within sports associations. This development owes much to a shift in our approach to the game, with less of a focus on the competitive aspect, as well as the work of the French Football Federation (FFF) across the entire country.

The UNSS continues to maintain a strong commitment in this area, as exemplified by the success of the 'Football for Princesses' initiative in secondary schools, plus plans to train 600 physical education teachers across all of France's local education authorities, the hosting of the world schools football championship in Bordeaux in 2013 and our Young Officials training programme. The success of those projects and the prospect of France hosting Euro 2016 naturally encouraged us to be even more proactive. Given our long tradition of organising events to coincide with major sporting occasions held in France, we made the logical decision to plan the ambitious educational programme outlined in this prospectus. Several different highlights will guarantee a frontline role for the UNSS during the tournament, including a European schools championship held in Lille and Lens a few days before Euro 2016, an international forum on good education and sports practices in Europe, and a programme to enliven and involve the entire country before and during Euro 2016.






A MESSAGE FROM BRIGITTE HENRIQUES, SECRETARY GENERAL OF THE FFF

EURO 2016 SAS EDITORIAL

France will hold UEFA EURO 2016 across ten host cities between 10 June and 10 July 2016. It is our ambition to bring together the best of football and the best of Europe to ensure a memorable tournament that represents the greatest possible celebration of football, fraternity and fun.

For the very first time, the competition will involve 24 national teams, which is a symbolic development. The opening of Europe's frontiers has, in turn, opened the frontiers of football.

UEFA EURO 2016 will be a major success if it is a popular, safe and welcoming event. And its success depends also on the widespread involvement and commitment of the largest possible number of young Europeans, both boys and girls. As part of its bid proposal, the French Football Federation (FFF) outlined plans to organise – at the same time as the EURO – a tournament bringing together national teams of youngsters from the 30 countries who did not qualify for the finals. The goal was clear: to welcome the whole of European football to France in 2016. Sport, and football in particular, can serve as a fantastic meeting ground and help build social links, especially among younger people. The idea that sport can serve an educational purpose, help forge identities and lead to individual and collective success stories is something that the Union Nationale du Sport Scolaire (National Union of School Sport) has been promoting within schools.

The UNSS and FFF have decided to bring this project to fruition in the form of 'Schools Euro 2016', a football tournament to be held in Lille and Lens at the start of June 2016.

UEFA EURO 2016 is naturally committed to contributing to this educational programme and offering all the support it can. The educational goals and activities proposed fit perfectly with the values of UEFA EURO 2016: the importance of sharing, the fostering of pride and the thrill of a popular celebration. Together, we hope to make UEFA EURO 2016 a football showcase that is also educational and civic-minded.

FROM 1 TO 7 JUNE 2016, A FEW DAYS BEFORE THE OPENING CEREMONY AT UEFA EURO 2016, THE TOWNS OF LENS AND LILLE WILL HOST THE EUROPEAN SCHOOL FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS FOR BOYS AND GIRLS.

'SCHOOLS EURO 2016' will be an event which strengthens the international and educational dimension of UEFA EURO 2016. In line with UEFA's own wishes, and building on plans outlined in France's bid proposal for UEFA EURO 2016, the UNSS will make it possible for countries that do not qualify for the senior finals to participate in the ultimate celebration of European football. Thanks to these school championships, all 54 of UEFA's member nations will be present in France.

AN ACADEMIC PROJECT FOCUSING ON EDUCATIONAL SUCCESS

IN ADDITION TO THE SPORTING DIMENSION, THE EUROPEAN SCHOOL FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS WILL CONTAIN A STRONG EDUCATIONAL COMPONENT. THE EVENT WILL PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY TO HIGHLIGHT THE DIVERSITY OF EDUCATIONAL PATHWAYS AND THE NUMEROUS DIFFERENT PROJECTS DEVISED TO HELP ALL PUPILS SUCCEED.

The youngsters of the UNSS and the Nord Pas-de-Calais region will be fully involved in organising the event, which will be planned, supervised, refereed and overseen by the UNSS's Young Officials – pupils and members of the UNSS who have undergone an FFF training scheme. Their skills will help the UNSS bolster the educational dimension of the event, while also highlighting the wide array of interests and diversity of talents of these young people.

THE UNSS'S YOUNG OFFICIALS

Young Refereeing Officials

The 12 best French referees and Young Officials will be present at the event after being selected at the end of the final phase of the UNSS 'Excellence' French football championship for secondary schools. They will convene just before the event for a two-day training course held in English at the site of the competition.

Young Organisers

A training programme will be held for young organisers, who will then get to welcome and look after the delegations.

Young Reporters

Pupils from a class whose journalistic project is selected by APELS and Le Monde will get to provide full media coverage of the competition.

Ball boys and girls

Training for ball boys and girls will be provided in schools close to the competition venues.

Sponsorship of delegations by schools

Every delegation will be sponsored by a football side from a school sports association in the Nord Pas-de-Calais region (there are 62 in the regional education authority). Before the event, a multidisciplinary effort will be undertaken to prepare an exhibition to coincide with the Euro.

PARTNERSHIPS

Guides and interpreters for each delegation

Pupils from international sections or studying foreign language Bacs and students from the faculty of languages will serve as guides and interpreters for each of the delegations.

Design and production of the trophies

A joint effort between pupils focusing on art and design and pupils dedicated to production.

Opening and closing ceremonies

The ceremonies will be planned and performed by the sports associations of schools within Lille's local education authority.

Cultural outings

Students studying for a BTS in Tourism and the sports associations of schools within Lille's local education authority will prepare and oversee the programme.

THE UNSS IS LOOKING FORWARD TO WORKING ALONGSIDE UEFA EURO 2016 SAS AND THE HOST CITIES BEFORE AND DURING THE TOURNAMENT, AND PLANS TO INCLUDE ITS PROJECTS IN THE GENERAL PROGRAMME OF ACTIVITIES AT THE UEFA EURO 2016 HOST SITES.

This programme needs to offer local people, spectators and visitors without match tickets a festive experience, while also integrating the sporting, social, economic and environmental priorities of the local authorities.

To bolster the public's response to UEFA EURO 2016 and ensure that the tournament is well received by inhabitants of the host cities, the UNSS's teams intend to involve local youngsters in sporting events throughout the 2015-16 school year and also during Euro 2016 itself.

These events will be organised in line with the ethical values central to school sport and cherished by its partners – most notably, respect for others, the fight against discrimination and the encouragement of female participation. They will promote the idea of sport for everyone, whatever their background, and endorse all forms of football.

SEPTEMBER 2015 TO MAY 2016

THE UNSS FRENCH CHAMPIONSHIPS IN THE COLOURS OF EURO 2016

To promote a spirit of competition in the lead-up to UEFA EURO 2016, the UNSS will be holding the French Championships during the school year ahead of the tournament. To help make the event possible, the UNSS will mobilise our 33,000 physical education teachers, the teams from our 9,500 school sports associations and our one million members, which includes 240,000 football and futsal players from all categories: boys' teams, girls' teams, disabled teams and joint able-bodied and disabled teams.


A regular staple now at every major event, fan zones should be places where foreign visitors and local inhabitants both young and old can meet and share memorable moments. The UNSS is planning to enliven the fan zones during UEFA EURO 2016 with sporting competitions that get everyone involved: **the UNSS Challenge Cups.**

Before each game at UEFA EURO 2016, young people from the host cities and local area will be able to watch 3 hours of football contested by local, departmental and regional school teams, who will qualify to take part during the UNSS French Championships.

Wherever the local authorities are in favour, the UNSS Challenge Cups will thus enable local inhabitants and the world of school sport to feel a greater involvement in UEFA EURO 2016, and will contribute to the success of UEFA EURO 2016 as a festive and popular occasion throughout the whole of France.
